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ABSTRACT

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Writing skill is important and needs to be given special attention because writing is considered as the most difficult and the biggest challenge for many of students. There are some difficulties that faced by the students' argumentative writing by the Second Semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta. Some of them got difficulties to choose the corrected vocabulary, and got lack of knowledge especially about inflectional morphemes.

This research studies about Inflectional Morphemes Errors in Argumentative Writing by Second Semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta. The purpose of this research are: (1) to describe the types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English language education of IAIN Surakarta; and (2) to describe the dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta.

This research was descriptive qualitative research. In collecting the data, the researcher used the student's argumentative writing text in midterm test result. Sixty data were analyzed by using the error analysis procedure which consists of collecting the error, identifying the error, classifying the types and the causes of error, explaining error and counting the numbers of error and the numbers of the causes. In classifying the types of inflectional morphemes errors, the researcher used the target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013) which consists of omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends. To measure the validity of the data, the researcher used triangulation trustworthiness.

The researcher found the kinds of inflectional morphemes errors. They are plural inflection errors, comparative inflections errors, possessive inflection errors, superlative inflection errors, third person singular inflection errors, past tense inflection errors, past participle inflection errors, and present participle inflection errors. The first percentage of inflectional errors comes to plural inflection errors with 36 of 59 items from the total errors (61.02 %). The second is third person singular errors with 9 of 59 items from the total errors (15.25 %). The third is possessive inflection errors and present participle inflections errors, each of them with 4 of 59 items from the total errors (6.78 %). The fourth is past participle inflection errors with 3 of 59 items from the total errors (5.10%). The fifth is comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors and past tense inflection errors, each of them with 1 of 59 items from the total errors (1.69%). It means the researcher found eight types of inflectional morphemes errors using target modification taxonomy.

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CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of the Study

English is taught in English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta as a foreign language (EFL). Students are expected to master well English skills, namely listening, speaking, reading and writing. The skills clasified into receptive and produiuctive. Listening and reading include to receptive skills, whereas speaking and writing include to productive skills. Those skills must be mastered by all students in learning English in Indonesian's school especially students of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta. The learners are expected to be able to master all of the four language skills.

Writing skill is the most important and needs to be separated and given special attention because writing is considered as the most difficult and the biggest challenge for many of students. It happens because writing obviously needs long process or much time, needs deep thought, expression, and understanding to create many interesting ideas. Furthermore, for English foreign language learners, the biggest challenge in writing well is mastering the aspects of writing, for example content, organization, vocabulary, grammar, and mechanics.

Grammar is part of the study of the way people speak understandable. Grammar does not only affect the way language units are combined to look right. It also influences its meaning. On the other hand, grammar is also meaningful make our language have the right meaning (Atika, 2018:14). In the learning of writing, we cannot ignore grammar in the part of learning process because in a writing or text, it should contain with at least one meaning.

Morpheme comes from the Greek, *morphe* that is form or shape. According to Haspelmath (2002:16), morphemes can be defined as the smallest meaningful constituents of a linguistic expression. Words may of course consist

of more than two morphemes, such as *un-happi-ness*, *read-abil-ity*, *un-friend-ly*, and *un-friend-li-ness*. There are two kinds of morphemes. They are free morphemes and bound morphemes. Free morphemes are morphemes that can stand on their own as a word because they carry meaning. Bound morphemes are morphemes that cannot stand on their own as a word. It means that a bound morpheme cannot occur independently (Yule, 1996:69).

Bound morphemes are divided into derivational morphemes and inflectional morphemes. It can be called grammatical indicators because they have the tendency to affect grammar. Yule (1996:69) states that inflectional morphemes are not used to produce new words in the English language, to indicate aspects of grammatical function of a word. There are some types of inflectional morphemes. For example: in plural -s and -es, in possessive -'s and s'/, in present participle -ing, in past tense -ed, in third person -s and -es, in comparative -er, in superlative -est, in past participle -ed and -en. Therefore, in the learning of grammar, we cannot ignore a morpheme as the part of learning grammar because the bound morpheme can affect grammar.

According to Carl James (2013:106), there are fifth types or errors based on the target modification taxonomy. They are omission, addition, misformation, misordering, and bends. He had modified error classification from previous expert, such as by Dulay, Burt and Krashen in 1982. Omission errors are characterized by the absence of items that must appear in well-formed sentence. For example; "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefit". The student omits –s in word *benefits*, that is incorrect because the word *benefit* should in plural. The correct sentence should be "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefits".

Addition errors are the opposite of omission errors. The characterized by the presence of items must no appear in well-formed of sentence. There are three types of addition; double marking, regularization, and simple additions. It means that the student adds unnecessary items in their word. For example; "He do not eats his bread". The student adds unnecessary item -s in word eats, that is

incorrect because the sentence is in negative sentence, the verb do not need add with -s. The correct sentence should be "He do not eat his bread".

Misselection is used of the wrong form of a structure or morpheme. Three types of misselection, there are regularization errors, archi-forms, alternating forms. Therefore, misselection means the students wrong in formating morpheme or structure. In this research. For example; "I *seen her yesterday". It is indeed that *seen* for *saw* is use of the wrong form, but people call it misformation but it is not misformation, what the learner who produced this error has done is not misform but misselect, and these should be called misselection.

Misplacement is characterized by the incorrect placement of a morpheme of group of morphemes in a sentence. James called this category with misplacement not misordering. For example; "He every time comes <u>late home</u>" the correct sentence should be "He every time comes home late".

Blends is the one of the category that complements the target modification taxonomy. It is typical of situations where there is not just one well-defined target, but two. The learner is undecided about which of these two targets he has 'in mind'. For example: "according to Erica's opinion", which arises when two alternative grammatical forms are combined to produce an ungrammatical blend. In this example according to Erica's and in Erica's opinion seems to have been blended.

The researcher has conducted a pre-research concerning with the use of inflectional morphemes in EFL students' writing. The pre-research was conducted at second semester students of English Language Education, IAIN Surakarta. The researcher selected two classes of argumentative writing course, namely class 2G and 2H. Based on the pre-research, it was found that there are some problems in students' writing. Many of the students did not understand about inflectional morphemes, and some of the students did error in using inflectional morphemes in their argumentative essay. The error in using inflectional morphemes for example:

The picture above shows the error in using the plural inflection made by RNAS. RNAS is the student of argumentative writing in 2G class. The student made addition error. The sentence "And also you absolutely thinking about a \underline{drugs} " is incorrect. The sentence should omit s in the word \underline{drugs} because a is an article to show the singular person. The correct sentence is "And also you absolutely thinking about a \underline{drug} ".

As the English foreign language, it is normal condition for students to have various problems or difficulties in writing. However, in learning English writing, EFL students need to learn about inflectional morphemes. According to Yule (1996:67), morpheme is a minimal unit of meaning or grammatical function. Units of grammatical function include forms used to indicate past tense, present, plural, and other. It means the inflectional morpheme can affect the grammar such as in plural, in possessive, in present participle, in past tense, in third person singular, in comparative, in superlative, and in past participle. If students do error in using inflecional morpheme, the grammar is automatically to be wrong. If the grammar is error, it makes misunderstanding of message to the receiver. According to Brown (1941:259), error can be observed, analyzed, classified, to reveal something in the learner's operating system that is directed towards a wave of study of learner's error. It means the researcher should observe, analyze, and classify the errors, to reveal flawed side of student's activities.

The researcher uses some previous studies to help the researcher in arranging this research. First research is "Grammatical Errors in Using Inflectional Morphemes in Writing at the Fifth Semester Students of English Education Department Based on Surface Strategy Taxonomy". This thesis is made by Atika Amalina from students of English Education Department of Raden Intan State islamic University Lampung (Atika, 2018). This research analyzed the error based on surface strategy taxonomy. The error found that the types of it are addition, misformation and misordering. Besides the types of errors, many of percentages of the error that made by the students was also discussed.

The second previous research related to this research is conducted by Endar Mutmainah (2019), the students of English Language Education of Cultures and Language Faculty of IAIN Surakarta "Morphological Error Analysis in Writing Skill of Recount Text at The Eighth Grade Students' Of MTS N 2 Surakarta in Academic Year 2018/2019". The researcher analyzed the dominant type of morphological error. He found the causes of Morphological errors; and how to overcome the problems.

Based on the first previous study, there are some differences were located on the subject, result, and problem formulation. If the first previous study investigated the types and percentages of errors just in regular inflectional morphemes from all morphology classes; and using surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982) to analyze the data. The researcher investigated types of morphemes in larger scope of inflectional morphemes. The researcher uses target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

Based on the second previous study, there are some differences were located in subject, result, and problem formulation. If the second previous study investigated the frequent, cause, and solution of Morphology errors. This research only investigates the types and dominant frequent of inflectional morphemes errors using target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013) to analyze the data.

Based on the explanation above, the researcher is interested to describe and analyze inflectional morphemes errors of students' English writing at the second semester of English Language Education. Then the researcher will conduct a research entitled "AN ANALYSIS OF INFLECTIONAL MORPHEMES ERRORS IN ARGUMENTATIVE WRITING BY THE SECOND SEMESTER OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE EDUCATION OF IAIN SURAKARTA". This research expected to describe and analyze the inflectional morphemes errors of EFL students' writing.

B. Limitation of the Problem

In this case, this research described and analyzed the students' errors in using inflectional morphemes. This research was focus on the inflectional morphemes errors that according to Yule (1996:69), English has only eight inflectional morphemes. They are in plural, in possessive, in present participle, in past tense, in third person, in comparative, in superlative, in past participle. The researcher uses Yule's theory and target modification by Carl James (2013:106) to analyze the inflectional morphemes. If the researcher found derivational errors or grammatical errors, the researcher ignored them. In this research, the researcher took the students' documents to get the errors. The researcher described and analyzed the errors made by students' argumentative at the second semester of English Language Education. The students are from G and H class.

C. Problem Formulation

Based on the background and the limitation of the problem, the researcher formulated the problem of this research to be:

1. What are the types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta?

2. What is the dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta?

D. The Objectives of the Study

Based on the formulation of the problem, the researcher made objectives of the research, it is to describe:

- To describe what are the types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta.
- To describe what is the dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta.

E. The Benefits of the Study

From this research, the researcher hoped that there are some benefits especially for the researcher, and for the reader as general. The results of this research to be useful theoretically and practically as follows:

1. Theoretical Benefit

This research can give contribution to science and knowledge especially in the study of linguistics. There is phenomenon of errors from the English foreign language students that should be investigated for the development of institution.

2. Practical Benefit

a. For the Researcher

The researcher will know about inflectional morphemes error of the EFL students' English writing through analyzing. Then the study could bring the researcher to a better understanding of writing skill.

b. For the Readers

The readers will get knowledge and information about the analysis of inflectional morphemes errors of EFL English writing of the second semester of English Language Education.

c. For the Teachers

The study was expected to give educational information for teachers in order to enrich their teaching writing method.

d. For the Students

The study was expected to give information and motivation, so students can maximize their writing skill.

e. For the Other Researchers

The study was expected to give information to the related studies on the future.

F. Definition of the Keys Terms

The researcher clarifies the terms of the study as follow:

1. Error

An error takes place when the deviation areas because of lack of knowledge. It represents a lack of competence. It is the result of processing problems that prevent learners from accessing their knowledge of a target language rule and cause of the fall back on some alternative, non-standard rule that they find easier to access (Ellis, 1999:51).

2. Error Analysis

Error analysis is an ancient activity at the same time a relatively new activity. In the old sense, it was only an informal activity and often about teachers who used the words of their students to assess whether they had, or not yet, the competence of the particular linguist he had tried in teaching. In other words, it was an informal means of assess and improve students (Corder, 1981:51).

3. Inflectional Morphemes

The word inflection according to etymology comes from traditional latin grammar. That comes from the root *flect* means *bend*. Inflection means changing the form of words. They fit in certain positions in a sentence. In processing that position, the lexicon is needed to be bending. The word formation does not change category and does not create new lexemes, but

rather changes the form of lexemes so that they fit into different grammatical contexts (Aronoff and Fudeman, 2011:159).

4. Writing

According to Byrne (1997:1), writing is the act of learning symbols, the symbols have to be arranged to words, from words have to be arranged to sentence, from sentences to be arranged to paragraph or text in particular order linked together in certain ways. In writing, the writer is able to express her or his ideas and give more pay attention to the rule of writing.

5. Argumentative Writing

According to Davis and Liss (2006:93), an argumentative essay is one kind of essay sometimes it called a persuasive essay. This kind of essay expresses an opinion about a controversial issue. This essay can persuade the reader to agree with the writer opinion by using strong logical reasons to support the agreement.

CHAPTER II

THEORETICAL REVIEW

In this chapter, the researcher presents some theories dealing with the topic, namely inflectional morpheme, error analysis, EFL students' English writing, and previous related studies. In the subchapter of concept of morpheme, the researcher presents the definition of morphemes, types of morphemes, inflectional morphemes, and types of inflectional morphemes. In the subchapter of error analysis, the researcher presents definition of error analysis, the difference between error and mistake, the types of error, and inflectional morphemes errors. In the subchapter of writing, the researcher presents definition of writing, aspect of writing, stages of writing, purposes of writing, and writing in the second semester of English Language Education.

A. Concept of Morphemes

1. Definition Morphology

According to Rochelle Lieber (2009:2), morphology is the study of word formation, including the ways new words are coined in the languages of the world, and the way forms of words are varied depending on how they are used in sentences. As a native speaker of your language, you have intuitive knowledge of how to form new words, and every day you recognize and understand new words that you've never heard before.

According to Martin Haspelmath (2002:1), morphology is the study of the internal structure of words. Somewhat paradoxically, morphology is both the oldest and one of the youngest subdisciplines of grammar. It is the oldest because, as far as we know, the first linguists were primarily morphologists.

According to Mark Aronoff and Kirsten Fudeman (2011:1), in etymology morphology refers to morph-means shape / form, and morphology is the study of form or forms. In biology, morphology refers to the study of

the form and structure of organisms, and in geology, it refers to the study of the configuration and evolution of land forms. In linguistics, morphology refers to the mental system involved in word formation or to the branch of linguistics that deals with words, their internal structure, and how they are formed.

Based from the experts above, the researcher has as a conclusion that the word morphology is from Greek. The word morph- means shape / form. Morphology is a disciplines study of grammar, discussing about the internal structure of word or word formation. It is deals with words, their internal structure, and how they are formed.

Morphological process fulfill two primary purposes, they are; (1) To create new word in language, and (2) To modify existing words. There are some observations about word and their arrangement:


- a. Some words can be divided into parts that still have meaning.
- b. Some words have sense by themselves, but some words have sense only when used with other words.
- c. Some of the pieces, which words can be, divided stand alone as words, but the other cannot.
- d. The word-parts that can occur only in combination must be combined correctly.
- e. Languages create new words systematically.

This definition becomes more comprehensible based on the examples below:

2. Definition of Morphemes

Morpheme comes from Greek. Word *morphe* is form or shape. According to Haspelmath (2002:16), morphemes can be defined as the smallest meaningful constituents of a linguistic expression. A word may consist of one or more morphemes, such as *un-happi-ness*, *read-abil-ity*, *un-friend-ly*, and *un-friend-li-ness*. Morphemes can have various kinds of meanings. Some meanings are very concrete and can be described easily but other meanings are abstract and more difficult to describe such as the morpheme *-al* in *logic-al*. Some meanings are so abstract that they can hardly be called meanings. For example, the Latin morpheme *-m* in *insula-m*.

The picture above shows the relation between sentences, morphemes and phonemes. In using the notion of morpheme, we can now say that morphological complex words consisting of a string of morphemes, in much time, it is the same way as sentences consisting of a string of words, and morphemes themselves consisting of a string of phonemes.

3. Types of Morphemes

Before understanding about the types of morphemes, the affixes, and other. There are three basic knowledge about morpheme. They are lexemes, root, stem, and base.

a. Lexemes

According to (haspelmath, 2002:12), Lexemes are abstract entities and can be thought of as sets of word-forms. Sometimes we will use the convention of writing lexemes in small capitals. For example, eating is a verb lexeme. It represents the core meaning shared by forms such as eat, ate, eaten, and eating. In most languages, dictionaries are organized according to lexemes. Therefore, it is usually reasonable to think of a lexeme as a 'dictionary word'. In the most interesting case, lexemes consist of a fair number of word-forms. The set of word-forms that belongs to a lexeme is often called a paradigm. As an example, the paradigm of the Latin noun lexeme *Insula* (singular) with *Insulam* (Plular).

b. Root

According to Katamba (1993:41), root is the irreducible core of a word, with absolutely nothing else attached to it. It is the part always present, possibly with some modification, in the various manifestations of a lexeme. For example, walk is a root and it appears in the set of wordforms that instantiate the lexeme *walk* such as walk, walks, walking and walked. The only situation where this is not true is when suppletion takes place. In that case, word-forms that represent the same morpheme do not share a common root morpheme. Thus, although both the word-forms good and better realize the lexeme *good*, only good is phonetically similar to *good*.

c. Stem

The stem is that part of a word that is in existence before any inflectional affixes have been added. Inflection is discussed in section. For example:

Noun stem	Plural
Cat	-S
Worker	-S

For the moment, a few examples should suffice: In the word-form cats, the plural inflectional suffix -s is attached to the simple stem cat, which is a bare root, i.e. the irreducible core of the word. In workers the same inflectional -s suffix comes after a slightly more complex stem consisting of the root work plus the suffix -er which is used to form nouns from verbs. Here work is the root, but worker is the stem to which -s is attached.

d. Base

A base is any unit whatsoever to which affixes of any kind can be added. The affixes attached to a base may be inflectional affixes selected grammatical category of the base. An unadorned root like boy can be a base since it can have attached to it inflectional affixes like -s to form the plural boys or derivational affixes like -ish to tum the noun boy into the adjective boyish. In other words, all roots are bases. Bases are called stems only in the context of inflectional morphology. Example: faith, faithful, bookshop.

According to Yule (1996:68-70), there are two kinds of morpheme. They are free morphemes and bound morphemes.

a. Free Morphemes

Free morphemes are morphemes that can stand on their own as a word because they carry meaning. It means that a free morpheme can occur independently and have meaning. The examples of free morphemes are cat, text, book, quick, school, boy, girl, teach, examine, church, mosque, and others. There are two categories of free morphemes:

1) Lexical Morphemes

Lexical morphemes are a set of ordinary nouns, adjectives, and verbs that we think of as the words that carry the content of the messages we convey. For examples: girl, man, house, tiger, sad, long, yellow, sincere, open, look, follow, and break. We can add new lexical morphemes to the language rather easily, so they are treated as an *open* class of words.

2) Functional Morphemes

Functional morphemes are a set of conjunctions, prepositions, articles, and pronouns, which consist largely of the functional words in language. Functional morphemes cannot be given affix. So they are described as a closed class of words meaning that it cannot make new meaning or word class. For example, after, before, when, while, at, under, the, we, you, on, because, above, it.

b. Bound Morphemes

Bound morphemes are morphemes that cannot stand on their own as a word. It means that a bound morpheme cannot occur independently. It has to be attached to a free morpheme to have a clear meaning. For example:

1) Unblessed

Bound morphemes have two categories. They are derivational morphemes and inflectional morphemes. Derivational morphemes are used to make new words in the language and are often used to make words

of a different grammatical category from the stem. A list of derivational morphemes will include suffixes such as the *-ish* in foolish, *-ly* in quickly, and the *-ment* in payment. The list will also include prefixes such as *re-*, *pre-*, *ex-*, *mis-*, *co-*, *un-* and many more. Whereas inflectional morphemes are not used to produce new words in the English language, but rather to indicate aspects of grammatical function of a word. Inflectional morphemes are used to show if a word is plural or singular, if it is a past tense or not, and other. Bound morphemes can be called grammatical indicators because they have the tendency to affect grammar. Bound morphemes also have two types of bound morphemes:

a. Bound roots

Bound roots are those bound morphemes which have lexical meaning when they are attached to other bound morphemes to form content words; e.g., - ceive in receive, conceive; -tain in retain, contain; plac- in implacable, placate; cran- in cranberry, etc. Notice that bound roots can be prefixed or suffixed to other affixes.

b. Affixes

Affixes are bound morphemes which are usually marginally attached to words and which change the meaning or function of those words; e.g., *-ment* in development, *en-* in enlarge; "s in John"s; *-s* in claps, *-ing* in studying

Bound morphemes are commonly called affix. There are two kinds of affix:

1) Prefix

Prefix is a syllable or syllables that appear in front of the root and can alter the meaning of the root. Prefix can be used only for derivational morphemes such as *en* in the word *enlarge*, *im* in the word *impatient*, and *un* in the word *unhappy*.

2) Infix

Katamba (1993: 44) states an infix is an affix inserted into the root itself. Infixes are very common in English languages and infixing somewhat rare in English. Infixation is not productive and only a limited number of infixed forms occur. Because of infixed forms are no longer felt by most people to contain an affix and there are listed separately from their bases in dictionaries.

3) Suffix

Suffix is a letter or letters that are added to the end of the root and can alter the original tense or meaning of the root. Suffix can be used for derivational morphemes and inflectional morphemes such as *-ance* in the word *performance*, *-able* in the word *readable*, and *-ing* in the word *reading*.

4. Inflectional Morphemes

According to Aronoff and Fudeman (2011:159), the word inflection according to etymology comes from traditional Latin grammar. It comes from the root *flect* means *bend*. Inflection means changing the form of words. They adapt in certain positions in a sentence. In processing that position, the lexicon is needed to be bending. The word formation does not change category and does not create new lexemes, but rather changes the form of lexemes so that they fit into different grammatical contexts. Inflectional morphemes refer to morphemes that do not change category and do not create new lexemes, but

rather change the form of lexemes so that they adapt into different grammatical contexts or meanings.

5. Types of Inflectional Morphemes

According to Yule (1996:69), English has only eight inflectional morphemes or inflections, as follow:

- a. To show plural inflection *s* and *es*, such as sentence "Tio got two books", added to noun *book*.
- b. To show possessive inflection -'s and -s'/, such as sentence "John's hat is red", added to noun *John*.
- c. To show comparative inflection *er*, such as sentence "Andy smarter than Tino, added to adjective *smart*.
- d. To show superlative inflection *est*, such as sentence "Bowo has largest farm" added to adjective *large*.
- e. To show third person singular inflection *s* and *es* in present tense, such as sentence "Dion drinks tea" added to verb *drink*.
- f. To show past tense inflection *ed*, such as sentence "Father work<u>ed</u> at home yesterday", added to verb *work*.
- g. To show present participle inflection *ing*, such as sentence "Al is studying", added to verb *study*.
- h. To show past participle inflection *ed* and *en*, such as sentence "Nina has taken some guitar to the party", added to verb *take*.

B. Error Analysis

1. Definition of Error Analysis

According to Corder (1981:51), error analysis is a relatively new activity. In the old sense, it was only an informal activity, sometimes it is used by teachers who used the student's words to assess whether they had, or not yet, on the competence of the particular linguist. In other words, it was an informal tool of assessing and improving students.

According to Dulay, Burt, Krashen (1982:138), error are the flawed side. It appears from the learner's speech or writing. They are parts of conversation or composition that deviate from some selected norm or mature language performance. Error analysis has yielded insight into the L2 acquisition process that has stimulated major changes in teaching practices. Brown (1941:259) also states, that error analysis is errors that can be observed, analyzed, classified, to reveal something in the learner's operating system that is directed towards a wave of study of learners error.

Based on explanation above, error analysis is a relatively new activity of assessing and improving students. It is aimed to find the flawed side of student's activities in speech or writing by using observing, analyzing, and classified.

2. The Difference between Error and Mistake

The distinction between error and mistake according to Ellis (1999:51), an error takes place when the deviation areas because of lack of knowledge. It represents a lack of competence. It is the result of processing problems that prevent learners from accessing their knowledge of a target language rule and cause of the fall back on some alternative, non-standard rule that they find easier to access. Mistakes are performance phenomena and are course of regular features of native-speaker speech, reflecting processing failures that arise because of competing, plans, memory limitations, and lack of automaticity. It represents a lack of performance. That means an error is caused by lack of knowledge, while a mistake due to irregularities in doing the utterance.

3. Types of Errors

According to Dulay, Burt and Krashen (1982: 146), the most useful and commonly used as bases for the descriptive classification of errors are linguistic category, surface strategy, comparative taxonomy, and communicate effect taxonomy. There are four types or errors based on the surface strategy taxonomy; omission, addition, misformation and misordering.

a. Omission (Ø)

Omission errors are characterized by the absence of items that must appear in well-formed sentence.

For example:

- a) The cellphone is often used because they have many benefit.
- b) No one disturb us.

In the first sentence, the student omits -s in word *benefits*, that is incorrect because the word *benefit* should in plural. The correct sentence should be "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefits". In the second sentence, the student omits -s in word *disturbs*, that is incorrect because the subject is in third person and that is present tense form, the verb should add with -s. The correct sentence should be "No one disturbs us".

b. Addition

Addition errors are the opposite of omission errors. The characterized by the presence of items must no appear in well-formed of sentence. Addition errors usually occur in the late stages of L₂ acquisition, when the learner has already acquired some target language rules. Dulay, Burt, Krashen (1982: 156) divides addition errors into three types; double marking, regularization, and simple addition.

1) Double Marking

Many addition errors are more accurately described as the failure to delete certain items which are required in some linguistic construction but not in others.

For example:

- a) The student does not understands the material.
- b) The boy did not *arrived* on times.

The first sentence "The student does not understands the material" is incorrect because it is in simple present tense. The correct sentence is "The student does not understand the material". The second sentence "The boy did not arrived on times" is incorrect because the

tense is simple past tense. Therefore, the correct is "The boy did not arrive on time".

2) Regularization

Regularization errors that fall under the addition category are those in which a marker that is typically added to a linguistics item is erroneously added to exceptional items of the given class that do not take a marker.

For example:

Incorrect	Correct
Womans	woman (plural from woman)
Childs	children (plural from child)
Buyed	bought (past tense from buy)

The examples above are regularization errors, in which the regular plural noun and tense markers respectively have been added to items that do not take markers.

3) Simple Addition

Errors of simple addition refer to the addition of one element to the correct sentence.

For example:

- a) I am is bored.
- b) He can to do it.

The first sentence "i am <u>is</u> bored" is incorrect sentence because there is an addition with the word *is*. So the correct sentence is "I am bored". And in the second sentence "he can <u>to</u> do it" is incorrect sentence because add with word to. So the correct sentence is "he can do it"

c. Misformation

Misformation errors are characterized by the use of the unacceptable forms of the morpheme or structure. There are three types of misformation errors; regularization error, archi-form, and alternating form.

1) Regularization Errors

Regularization errors are errors in which regular marker are used place of irregular ones. For example, the verb *run* does not become *runned*, but *ran*; the noun *goose* does not become *gooses* in plural, but *geese*. Whenever there are both regular and irregular forms and constructions in a language, learners apply the rules used to produce the regular ones to those that are irregular, resulting in errors of regularization.

The difference between regularization error of addition and regularization error of misformation are located in the perspective of the error. Regularization error of addition is error in the adding of irregular marker, while regularization error of misformation is the error in the using form of regular marker to irregular marker. If there is regularization of addition, sometimes the error also includes into regularization of misformation.

For example:

- a) Fadli buyed a cake, yesterday.
- b) Ika is beautiful womans.

Words *buyed* and *womans* above include into regularization error of addition and regularization error of misformation.

2) Archi-forms

The selection of marker of one member of a class of forms to represent other in the class is a common characteristic of all stages of English foreign learners. The forms that selected by the learner is called archi-form. The following examples are dealing with the use of demonstrative adjective *this, that, these,* and *those*.

For example:

- a) That lamps.
- b) This hands.
- c) These pen.
- d) Those car.

This type of misformation errors has been called archi-form. Word *that* should be followed by singular form, while *these* should be followed by plural. The correct phrases are *those lamps, these hands, this pen, their car*.

3) Alternating Form

As learner's vocabulary and grammar grow, the use of archiform often gives away to the apparently free alternative of various member of class with each other.

For example:

- a. I see her yesterday.
- b. He would have <u>saw</u> them.

The sentences above have incorrect use of the verbs *see* and *saw*. Those should be *saw* and *seen*.

d. Misordering

Misordering errors are characterized by the incorrect placement of a morpheme of group of morphemes in a sentence. Misordering errors occur systematically for both L_2 and L_1 learners in constructions that have already been acquired, specifically simple (direct) and embedded (indirect) questions.

For example:

- a) Do you know who is she?
- b) What you are thinking about?

The first sentence "do you know who is she?" is incorrect sentence because there is misordering of word. The second sentence "what you are thinking about?" is also incorrect sentence because there is misordering of word. So the correct sentences are "do you know who she is?" and "what you are thinking about?".

According to Carl James (2013:106), there are fifth types or errors based on the target modification taxonomy. They are omission, addition,

misformation, misordering, and bends. He had modified error classification from previous expert, such as by Dulay, Burt and Krashen in 1982.

a. Omission (Ø)

This is to be distinguished from ellipsis (E), and from zero (Z), elements which are allowed by the grammar (indeed are powerful grammatical resources), whereas omission is ungrammatical. Compare two sentences below:

"He'll pass his exam but I won't [pass my exam]". (This is Ellipsis)

"He'll pass his exam and I'll (Ø) too". (This is Omission)

the learners tends to affect function words rather than content words in early stages. Moreover, advanced learners tend to be aware of their ignorance of content words, rather than omit one.

b. Addition

This manifestation of error, Dulay, Burt and Krashen suggest, is the 'result of all-too-faithful use of certain rules' (1982: 156), and they suggest there are subtypes. The subtypes are:

1) Regularization

Regularization which involves overlooking exceptions and spreading rules to domain where they do not apply. Example: producing regular *buyed for bought.

2) Double Marking

double marking is defined as failure to delete certain items which are required in some linguistic constuctions but not in other. Example: He doesn't know*s me contains a redundant third person - s on the main verb *know*, redundant because the auxiliary do already carries that maker.

3) Simple Addition

Simple addition, which caters for all additions not describable as double markings or regularizations.

Example: "The young woman *whom sits in the corner is my sister".

The learners use relative pronoun whom rather than who. The

student add morpheme -*m* in that sentence. the correct one is relative pronoun who which has function as subject. The correct sentence should be "The young woman who sits in the corner is my sister".

c. Misselection (Misformation)

Misselection is used of the wrong form of a structure or morpheme.

Example: "I *seen her yesterday".

It is indeed that *seen* for *saw* is use of the wrong form, but they are call it misformation. It is not misformation, what the learner who produced this error has done is not misform but misselect, and these should be called misselection.

d. Misplacement (Misordering)

James called this category with misplacement not misordering. That category is relatively uncontroversial. Part of linguistical competence, in addition to selecting the right forms to use in the right context, is to arrange them in the right order. Some languages have stricter word-order regulation than others. Russian is freer than English. Modern English is less free in its word order than Old English. In English certain word classes seem to be especially sensitive to misordering, for instance adverbials, interrogatives and adjectives.

Example:

"He every time comes <u>late home</u>" the correct sentence should be "He every time comes home late".

e. Blends

This is one of the category that complements the target modification taxonomy. It is typical of situations where there is not just one well-defined target, but two. The learner is undecided about which of these two targets he has 'in mind'. In such situations the type of error that materializes in the blend error, sometimes called the contamination or cross-association or hybridization error.

Example: "according to Erica's opinion", which arises when two alternative grammatical forms are combined to produce an ungrammatical blend. In this example according to Erica's and in Erica's oppinion seems to have been blended.

According to James (1998: 142), errors in language writing are divided into lexical errors and grammar error.

a. Lexical Error

James classifies lexical errors into two categories: formal errors and semantic errors: Formal Error, for example: a misselection occurs when the lexeme is confusable, and if these are pairs (or triples) of words that look and sound similar, such as: considerable/ considerate, competition / competitiveness, reserve/ preserve,, consumption / resumption/ assumption. (when some lexemes have the same root but different suffixes and prefixes). Semantic Errors, for example: a more general term is used where a specific one is needed, such as. The flower had a special*smell (scent/perfume).

b. Grammar Error

James classifies grammar errors into two categories: morphology errors and syntax errors. Morphology Errors, for example: six book*, (plural –s is needed in the sentence). Syntax errors, for example: (He is) *a cleverest boy in the class (misselection of the article at position modifier in noun phrase)

In this study, researcher takes the errors classification from James (1998) as his framework and limits his study only in term of morphological errors. Therefore, if it is found syntax errors, it will be neglected.

4. Inflectional Morphemes Errors

The researcher combines eight inflectional morphemes from Yule (1996:69) and target modification taxonomy from Carl James (2013:106) to find inflectional morphemes errors. The use of inflectional morphemes that contain with plural inflection morphemes, possessive inflection, show

comparative inflection, show superlative inflection, third person singular inflection, past tense inflection, present participle inflection, and past participle inflection. They will analyzed with omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends. The combination produces:

a. Plural Inflection Errors

The errors when the inflection *s* and *es* comes in plural form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

b. Possessive Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection - 's and -s' / comes in possessive form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

c. Comparative Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *er* comes in comparative form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

d. Superlative Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *est* comes in superlative form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

e. Third Person Singular Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *s* and *es* comes in third person singular form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

f. Past Tense Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *ed* comes in past tense form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

g. Present Participle Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *ing* comes in present participle form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

h. Past Participle Inflection Error

The errors when the inflection *ed* and *en* comes in past participle form. The errors are analyzed using omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

C. Writing

1. Definition of Writing

Writing is one of four basic skills in English that should be mastered by second language learners. According to Byrne (1997:1), writing is the act of learning symbols, the symbols have to be arranged to words, from words have to be arranged to sentence, from sentences to be arranged to form paragraph or text in particular order linked together in certain ways. In writing the writer is able to express her or his ideas and give more pay attention to the rule of writing. According to Coulmas (1996:1), there are six meanings of writing can be distinguished:

- a. A system of recording language by means of visible or tactile marks
- b. The activity of putting such a system to use
- c. The result of activity such a text
- d. The particular form of such a result, a script style such as block letter writing.
- e. Artistic composition
- f. A professional occupation

2. Aspect of Writing

According to Tribble in Atika (2018:12), there are five aspects that are used in writing, namely content, organization, vocabulary, language, and mechanics.

a. Content

Content refers to the experience of the main idea (unity). It can be identified by seeing the topic sentence. The topic sentence should express the main idea and reflect the whole paragraph.

b. Organization

It refers to the organization of the content or coherence. This aspect relates from one main idea to another main idea so, the main ideas connect each other.

c. Vocabulary

Vocabulary in this aspect means select words that are suitable to the content.

d. Language

Language refers to the grammar. The writer has to choose correct grammar to make a sentence well-formed.

e. Mechanics

It refers to the use of graphic conventional of the language such as punctuation, spelling and capitalization.

3. Stages of Writing

According to Harmer (2004:5), there are four stages of writing, namely planning, drafting, editing, and final draft.

a. Planning

In planning stage, the writer plan what they are going to write. The writer should think about purpose, audience, and content structure.

b. Drafting

Draft is the first version of a piece of writing. The writer makes lines of assumption that will be amended later.

c. Editing

After drafting stage, the writer should read the draft deeply. Find the words or sentence that made the reader confused. Change the words or sentence to be clear.

d. Final Draft

After the writer edited his draft, it will be the final version. This may look considerably different from the plan or first draft because things have changed in the editing process.

4. Purposes of Writing

According to Harmer (2008:39), effective writers usually have a purpose in mind and construct their writing with a view to achive that purpose. There are three main categories of learning which it is worth considering:

a. English as a Second Language (ESL)

This term is normally used to describe students who are living in the target language community and who need English to fuction in that community on basic writing of daily conversation.

b. English for Specific Purposes (ESP)

Many students study English for specific purpose, such people who are going to work as nurse in Britain, she should study medical English. The choice of topics and tasks for such students should not only develop their general language competence but also be relevant to their reason for study. Likewise nurse in training, when asked to write up a simulated patient record in their English class, she will clearly see the value of such a task.

c. English for Foreign Language (EFL)

This is generally taken to apply to students who are studying general English at schools and institutes in their own country or as transitory visitors in a target language country. In EFL, there are real purpose task and invented purpose. Real purpose tasks are precisely the ones that we can predict our students will probably need to perform at some stages. Invented purposes are purposes that engaging to be directly relevant to our students' future needs.

5. Argumentative Writing in the Second Semester of English Language Education

The students of English Language Education were getting some courses in the second semester. One of the courses is argumentative writing course. In argumentative course, the students focus on understanding and practicing how to make a good essay. The type of the essay is argumentative essay.

According to Davis and Liss (2006:93), an argumentative essay is one kind of essay sometimes it called a persuasive essay. This kind of essay expresses an opinion about a controversial issue. The goal of this essay is to persuade the reader to agree with the writer opinion by using strong logical reasons to support the agreement. They mention the organization of the argumentative should have:

a. Introduction

In argumentative essay, the hook introduces the issue. The background information gives a broader picture of the issue and why it is important. It can give details about the history of the people involved, what they want, and how it affects them. The thesis statement clearly states the writer's point of view about the issues.

b. Body Paragraph

Davis and Liss (2006:93) state in the body paragraph, the topic sentence in each body paragraph present one distinct reason for the writer's point of view stated in the thesis. All supporting details in each paragraph must support the topic sentence. These details can be facts, example, statistics, definition, causes, and effects, quotations, anecdotes, or questions. The writer often presents an opposing opinion (a counterargument). However the writer may express some agreement with the opposing view (a concession). But it will show evidence that the argument is stronger (a refutation).

c. Conclusion

In conclusion, it restates the argument that appeared in the thesis. It can end with prediction, a warning, or other type of comment that reinforces the writer's viewpoints. It may state the general issue in a broader context.

In the lesson of creating essay, there are four sections that should passed by the student. In the each section students get assignment from the lecture. The first section is intro. The intro should contain with hook, background information, and thesis. The second section is the argument. In the argument section, discusses about the claim and evidence. The third section is refuting opponent's arguments. In this section, discusses about opponents' views and offers the rebuttal. The last section is conclusion, the students learn about how to restate the importance of their issue, and the use of ramifications.

D. Previous Related Studies

In this chapter, the researcher presents some similar studies. There are some researchers, who have conducted similar research to this research of analysis of inflectional morphemes error. Those previous researches help the researcher to write this research. Their previous researches are as follows:

The first research related to this study is conducted by Atika (2018), the student of English Education Department, Tarbiyah and Teacher Training Faculty of Raden Intan State Islamic University Lampung entitled "Grammatical Errors in Using Inflectional Morphemes in Writing at the Fifth Semester Students of English Education Department Based on Surface Strategy Taxonomy". This research analyzed inflectional morpheme error based on surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982). Atika found the error types. They are addition, misformation and misordering. Besides the types of errors, she found many of percentages of error that the students made. According to her result, it is found that the first percentage of error comes to omission which is 52 of 84 items from the total errors (61.90 %). The second is

addition type which is 22 of 84 items from the total errors (26.20 %). The third is misformation which is 10 of 84 (11.90 %). Meanwhile the researcher did not find misordering type in the students' writing.

Based on the first previous study, there are some differences, which were located on the subject, result, and the problem formulation. If first previous study investigated the types and percentages of inflectional morphemes errors from descriptive text of students' morphology classes in fifth semester of UIN Raden Intan Lampung, this research investigates the types and the dominant type of inflectional morphemes errors of argumentative essays of EFL students at second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta. While the first previous study analyzed the data using surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982). The researcher uses target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

The second previous research related to this research is conducted by Endar Mutmainah (2019), the students of English Language Education of Cultures and Language Faculty of IAIN Surakarta "Morphological Error Analysis in Writing Skill of Recount Text at The Eighth Grade Students' Of MTS N 2 Surakarta In Academic Year 2018/2019". The researcher analyzed the dominant type of morphological error using target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013) to analyzed the data; he found the causes of Morphological errors; and how to overcome the problems. The researcher found the total errors in this research are; 76 times in the students' paragraph writing of recount text which consists of 2 times or 2,63%. Errors in omission of noun plural -s, 12 times or 15,79% errors omission of past tense -ed, 55 times or 72,37 % errors in misselection of verb, 5 times or 6,58% errors in misselection of adjective, 1 times or 1,31% errors misselection of noun, and 1 times or 1,31% error adverb morphology error. Meanwhile, the dominant error made by the students is misselection of verb morphology which reaches 55 times or 72, 37 % from 76 or 100%.

Based on the second previous study, there are some differences were located in subject, result, and problem formulation. If the second previous study

investigated the frequent, cause, and solution of Morphological errors. This research only investigates the types and dominant frequent of inflectional morphemes errors using target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013) to analyzed the data.

The third previous research. It is conducted by Apriyanto (2019), the students of English Education Department, of Tarbiyah and Teacher Training Faculty of State Institute for Islamic Studies of Metro entitled "An Error Analysis of Using Inflectional Morpheme Made by the Tenth Grade Students of SMK PGRI 1 Punggur Central Lampung". It aimed to identify the types and causes of errors in the use of five English morphological inflections. They were plural inflection, possessive inflection, present participle inflection, past tense inflection, and third person singular inflection. The first result shows that possessive inflection error is on the first rank (32 or 34,04%). The second result is factors causing errors in the use of five English inflectional morphemes. The causes are internal factor and external factor. Internal factor such as their interest, they do not pay attention toward the explanation given. While external factor is a brief explanation from the teacher and method of teaching because how well the students understand the material depends on the method of teaching that teacher uses.

Based on the third previous study, there are some differences were located in subject, result, problem formulation. The second previous study investigated the types of errors in the use of five English morphological inflections made by the tenth grade student of SMK PGRI 1 Punggur, and this research investigates the types and the dominant type of inflectional morphemes errors of EFL students at second semester of English Language Education based on surface strategy taxonomy. While the second previous study analyzed the data using surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982). The researcher uses target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

The fourth previous research related to this study is conducted by Diaz (2015), the student of English and Literature Department of Languages and Arts Faculty of State University of Medan entitled "An Analysis of Inflectional

Morphemes Errors in The Text Written by Second-Year Students of SMA Negeri 1 Stabat". He found that the types of inflectional morphemes errors in the text written by second-year students of SMA Negeri 1 Stabat are omission, addition and misformation. Omission is errors dominantly occured. The cause of errors dominantly occurred on intralingual transfer with (59.6%).

Based on the fourth previous study, there are some differences were located in subject, result, problem formulation. The third previous study investigated the types and causes of errors in using inflectional morphemes at ninth grade student of SMA Negeri 1 Stabat, and this research investigates the types and the dominant type of inflectional morphemes errors of EFL students at second semester of English Language Education based on surface strategy taxonomy. While the third previous study analyzed the data using surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982). The researcher uses target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

The fifth research is a journal article from Widhiya and Lukmanul (2018), the students of English Department of the State Islamic Institute of Metro entitled "An Analysis of Inflectional Affixes Error in Argumentative Writing". This research analyzed types of inflectional morphemes errors texts written by the fifth semester students of IAIN Metro. Based on the results, there are eight errors in using -s, 2 errors in using -es, 1 error in using -ies, 13 errors in using -ed, 3 errors in using -ing, and there is no error in using -er and -est. The first error that commonly found is the use of -ed.

Based on the fifth previous study, there are some differences were located in subject, result, problem formulation. The fourth previous study investigated the types and the percentages of errors in using inflectional morphemes by fifth semester students of IAIN Metro, and this research investigates the types and the dominant type of inflectional morphemes errors of EFL students at second semester of English Language Education based on surface strategy taxonomy. While the fourth previous study analyzed the data using surface strategy taxonomy by Dulay, Burt, and Krashen (1982). The researcher used target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

CHAPTER III

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

In this chapter, the researcher presents some domains dealing with the topic, namely research design, setting of the study, subject of the study, data source, data collecting technique, data analysis technique, and trustwothiness of data.

A. Research Design

In this research, the researcher used descriptive qualitative method. According to Haryanto (2018:198), the definition of descriptive research is a research method used to describe the existing phenomena as accurately as possible. The main goal of descriptive research is to describe systematically the existing phenomena under the study. Therefore, this method is called descriptive is a method that aims to describe the problem or phenomena under the study.

The researcher described and analyzed types and dominant type of errors using inflectional morphemes of EFL students' English writing. The researcher aims to find the types and dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes of English writing texts at the second semester of English Language Education based on target modification taxonomy.

B. Setting of the Study

1. Place

This research was conducted in the second semester of English Language Education, culture and language faculty of IAIN Surakarta. It is located at Jl. Pandawa, Dusun IV, Pucangan, Kartasura, Sukoharjo, Jawa Tengah, 57168.

2. Time

This research wass conducted on April 2020. The data collection was held after EFL students of the second semester finishes their midterm test.

C. Subject of the Study

The researcher chosen students of G and H class of the second semester of English Language Education students of IAIN Surakarta as the subject. The lecturer of those classes recommended his classes for my research to find types and dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes of EFL students' English writing. The reasons of the researcher choosing those classes are the researcher found some problems in the student's writing when the rearcher did pre research in there, many of the students do not understand about inflectional morphemes, and some of the students did error in using inflectional morphemes. Considering reasons above, the researcher chosen the G and H class for the subject of this research. The number of students in G class is 34 (5 male, 29 female), and the number of students in H class is 37 (6 male, 31 female). The total number of students in G and H class is 71 but there are 11 students absent and did not submit their task. Therefore, the researcher took only 60 students from G and H class.

D. Data Source

The data in this research is in the form of document. The documents were the texts written by the students in the second semester of English Language Education especially at class 2G and 2H of argumentative writing course. The written texts were the results of midterm test of the students.

E. Data Collecting Technique

According to Sugiyono (2018:401), in the qualitative research, the main data collecting technique are participant observation, deep interview, study of documentation, or mixing of three of them, the mixing of observation, interview, and documentation called triangulation. The technique of collecting data that used in this research is documentation. The researcher collected the data from the argumentative essay of EFL students of English Language Education. The argumentative essay is the results of midtern test of G and H class. After the focus of the research becomes clear, the researcher can develope the instrument.

It may complete the data and compare the previous data (Sugiyono, 2019:307). The researcher will use document as a form of data. The document is from students' argumentative essay on midtern test. The students' writing results was analyzed using target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013).

F. Data Analysis Technique

After collecting the data, the researcher described and analyzed the data based on target modification taxonomy. According to Sugiyono (2018:335), data analysis is the process of systematically searching and compiling data, obtained from interviews, field notes, and documentation. The researcher uses the four steps by Ellis (1985: 296), for analyzing the data. She states that the steps of analyzing data are identifying errors, classifying errors, explaining errors, and evaluating errors. The steps used by the researcher are:

1. Collecting the Data

The researcher collected the results of students' midterm test as the data.

2. Identifying Errors

The researcher identified the types of inflectional morphemes errors of EFL students by target modification taxonomy by underlining the errors. The researcher will ignore the other kind of error such grammar error, punctuation error, and derivational morphemes errors because the focus of this study is only the inflectional morphemes errors, for example *he is inperfect person*. It is the example of derivational morpheme error. The researcher will ignore it.

3. Classifying Errors

The researcher classified the errors based on the types of target modification taxonomy whether it is omission, addition, misordering or misformation. The researcher will use table to classify the errors. The table should follow:

4. Explaining Errors

The next step is finding out the frequency of errors on every type of error. In every sentence, the error might have more than one type of error. The calculation was conducted in every sentence. The researcher will explain what kind of the error it is, why it is an error, and what it should be. For example, there is error in a word *womans*. The error type is addition. The word incorrect because there is addition *s* in the word *woman*, it is a plural word and do not need to add *s* in the end of the word. The correct word should be *woman*.

5. Calculating Errors

The researcher calculated the total errors from each type of classification of errors based on target modification taxonomy to describe the percentages of students' errors. According to Anas in Atika (2018:63), to count the percentage of the errors, the researcher uses the formula proposed by Sudjiono in Susanti (2020:52) as follow:

In this step, the types of errors will display on a table that allowed the researcher to draw the conclusion.

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G. Technique of Coding Data

The researcher used code to analyzing the data. According Hubberman

in Endar (2019:53) codes are tags or labels for assigning units of meaning to the

descriptive or inferential information compiled during a study. The example of

H. Trustworthiness of Data

To measure the validity of the data, the researcher used triangulation trustworthiness. Triangulation is a technique of physical measurement that it has a powerful way of demonstrating concurrent validity especially in qualitative research (Cohen, 2007:141).

a. Theoretical Triangulation

This type draws upon alternative or competing theories in preference to utilizing one viewpoint only.

b. Methodological Triangulation

This type uses either the same method on different occasions, or different methods on the same object of study.

c. Investigator Triangulation

This type engages some observers to make the data valid, the data that was discovered independently by more than one observer is preferable.

In this research, the researcher will use investigator triangulation as the technique of data validity. The data findings were discussed with the English writing lecturer of IAIN Surakarta Mr. Furqon Edi Wibowo, M.Pd. The lecturer checked the data that are analyzed by the researcher. Then, if the data are considered valid by the English writing lecturer, the findings will be entered into the research report.

CHAPTER IV

FINDING AND DISCUSSION

In this chapter the researcher was analyzed the data collected by students writing text about argumentative text in the second semester of English Language Education. The researcher answers the problem formulation of this research. They are; what are the types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta?; what is the dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta?.

A. Finding

1. Result of the Research

In this research, the documentation was the main instrument of this research. The researcher collects data from the argumentative results of the second semester of English Language Education. The researcher chooses the G and H class for the subject of this research. The number of students in G class is 34 (5 male, 29 female), and the number of students in H class is 37 (6 male, 31 female). The total number of students in G and H class is 71 but there are 11 students absent and did not submit their task. Therefore, the researcher took only 60 students from G and H class. After analyzing the data, the researcher found that there were eight kinds of inflectional morphemes errors in argumentative writing using target modification taxonomy; they are omission, addition, and misselection. The first percentage of inflectional errors comes to plural inflection errors with 36 of 59 items from the total errors (61.02 %). The second is third person singular errors with 9 of 59 items from the total errors (15.25 %). The third is possessive inflection errors and present participle inflections errors, each of them with 4 of 59 items from the total errors (6.78 %). The fourth is past participle inflection errors with 3 of 59 items from the total errors (5.10%). The fifth is comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors and past tense inflection errors, each of them with 1 of 59 items from the total errors (1.69%).

2. Types of Student Errors in Using Inflectional Morpheme

a) Student 1

The student 1 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Teen Marriage and Should They be Allowed?". The student did 5 plural inflection errors and 1 possessive inflection error. They are:

1) S1/OMS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Marriage is one of the basic need of everyone's life.". The error is located in the word *need*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *need* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. That word contains the root *need*, the stem *needs*, and the base *needs*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Marriage is one of the basic needs of everyone's life.".

2) S1/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "While others are suffered by terrible problem within their family.". The error is located in the word *problem*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *problem* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. The word contains the root *problem*, the stem *problems*, and the base *problem*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "While others are suffered from a terrible problems within their family.".

3) S1/OMS3/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Getting married at the age of teen affects the wife's health badly.". The error is located in the word *teen*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *teen* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It has a root *teen*, the stem *teens*, and the base *teen*. The word should add with suffix –s and the word should be on plural form. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Getting married at the age of teens affects the wife's health badly.".

4) S1/OMS4/PLR

The student wrote sentence "In other word.". The error is located in the word "word". Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word "word" is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root word, the stem words, and the base word. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In other words.".

5) S1/OMS5/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Firstly, those who marry teen are expected to deal with." The error is located in the word *teen*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *teen* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *teen*, the stem *teens*, and base *teen*. The word should add with suffix –s and the word should be on plural form. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Firstly, those who marry teens are expected to deal with."

6) S1/MSL1/PSS

The student wrote sentence "One more thing is that young couples cannot take care about their wife's well-being during their pregnancy,". The error is located in the word wife's. Because, the student did error in selecting the suffix –'s (misselection). Moreover, it should on the correct possessive form. It contains the root wife, a stem wives, and the base wife. The student should add the suffix –s' after the word wives. The morpheme – 's is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "One more thing is that young couples cannot take care about their wives' well-being during their pregnancy".

b) Student 2

The student 1 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Do We Need Cell Phones?". The student did 2 third person singular inflection errors, 1 comparative inflection error, 1 plural inflection error, and 1 past participle inflection errors. They are:

1) S2/OMS1/TPN

The student wrote sentence "In this era, everything going easy and simple because the newest technology make our life more simple". The error is located in the word *make*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *make* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *make*, the stem *makes*, and the base *make*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In this era, everything going easy and simple because the newest technology makes our life simpler".

2) S2/OMS2/CPR

The student wrote sentence "In this era, everything going easy and simple because the newest technology make our life more simple". The error is located in the word *simple*. Because, the student omits the

suffix -r (omission). Moreover, it should on comparative form. The word *simple* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *simple*, the stem *simpler*, and the base *simple*. The word should add with suffix -r. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In this era, everything going easy and simple because the newest technology makes our life simple<u>r</u>".

3) S2/OMS3/TPN

The student wrote sentence "First is cell phone can bringing security for many people, personal security make the cellphones be the factor a person to use it." The error is located in the word *make*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *make* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *make*, the stem *makes*, and the base *make*. The word should add with suffix – s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "First is cell phone can bringing security for many people, personal security makes the cellphones be the factor a person to use it."

4) S2/OMS4/PLR

The student wrote sentence "People talk about many topics on their cell phone.". The error is located in the word *need*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *need* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *need*, the stem *needs*, and the base *need*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "People talk about many topics on their cell phones.".

4) S2/ADS1/PAP

The student wrote sentence "The result of the research can motivated the people including young people.". The error is located in the word *motivated*. Because, the student adds the suffix –ed (addition). Moreover, it should not on past participle form. It has a root *motive*, a base *motivate*, a stem *motivate* and a suffix –ed. The word should omit the suffix –ed. The morpheme –ed is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "The result of the research can motivate the people including young people".

c) Student 5 (S1/OMS5/PLR)

The student 5 wrote argumentative essay entitled "One Meaningful Step". The student did 1 third person singular inflection errors. The student wrote sentence "No one disturb us in step.". The error is located in the word *disturb*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *disturb* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *disturb*, the stem *disturbs*, and the base *disturb*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "No one disturbs us in step".

d) Student 7

The student 7 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Cellphone Needs In Daily Life". The student did 1 plural inflection errors and 2 possessive inflection errors. They are:

1) S7/OMS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Cellphone are often used because they have many benefit such as the one is used to communicate.". The error is located in the word *benefit*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *benefit* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *benefit*, the stem *benefits*, and the base *benefit*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefits such as the one is used to communicate.".

2) S7/ADS1/PSS

The student wrote sentence "A cellphone is an electronic device that is used to communicate in modern world like today's." The error is located in the word *today's*. Because, the student adds the suffix –'s (addition). Whereas, it should not on possessive form. It contains the root *today*, the stem *todays*, and the base *today*. The word should omit the suffix –'s. The morpheme –'s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "A cellphone is an electronic device that is used to communicate in a modern world like today."

3) S7/ADS1/PSS

The student wrote sentence "many ojek online and online shop like today's." The error is located in the word *today's*. Because, the student adds the suffix –s (addition). Moreover, it should not on possessive form. The word *today's* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. It contains the root *today*, the stem *todays*, and the base *today*. The word should omit the suffix –'s. The morpheme – 's is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Many ojek online and online shop like today.".

e) Student 8

The student 8 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Why Gadget is Very Important in Everyday Life?". The student did 1 third person singular inflection errors and 3 plural inflection errors. They are:

The student wrote sentence "Gadget become populer in now days.". The error is located in the word *become*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *become* is a free morpheme that can standalone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *become*, the stem *becomes*, and the base *become*. The word should add with suffix –s. The

morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Gadget becomes popular in nowdays.".

2) S8/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "And many reason why gadgets are important". The error is located in the word *reason*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *reason* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *reason*, the stem *reasons*, and the base *reason*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "And many reasons why gadgets are important".

The student wrote sentence "The feature in the gadget make use feel good." The error is located in the word *make*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *make* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *make*, the stem *makes*, and the base *make*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "The feature in the gadget makes us feel good."

f) Student 9

The student 9 wrote argumentative essay entitled "How Important the Gadgets Is For Life". The student did 2 plural inflection errors and 1 third person singular inflection errors. They are:

1) S9/OMS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Because many negative effect are also caused". The error is located in the word *effect*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *effect* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *effect*, the stem *effects*, and the base *effect*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Because many negative effects are also caused"

2) S9/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Human will surely encounter many difficulties.". The error is located in the word *human*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *human* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *human*, the stem *humans*, and the base *human*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "and many reasons why gadgets are important"

3) S9/OMS3/TPN

The student wrote sentence "Gadget do have a lot of influence both in positive and negative terms". The error is located in word do. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word do is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root do, the stem does, and the base do. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct

sentence should be "Gadget do<u>es</u> have a lot of influence both in positive and negative terms".

g) Student 12

The student 12 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Lose Weight with Swimming?". The student did 3 plural inflection errors. They are:

1) S12/OMS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Swimming 30 - 60 minutes in 4-6 days on a week can help people to lose weight and health risk such as". The error is located in the word risk. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word risk is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root risk, the stem risks, and the base risk. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Swimming 30 - 60 minutes in 4-6 days on a week can help people to lose weight and health risks such as"

2) S12/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Swimming also keep blood sugar under control and increase insulin sensitivity.". The error is located in the word *keep*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *keep* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *keep*, the stem *keeps*, and the base *keep*. The word should add with suffix –s and the word should be on plural form. Moreover, it should on superlative form. The word *low* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *low*, the stem *lows*, and the base *low*. The word should add with suffix *-est* and the word should be on superlative form. The morpheme *-est* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Indonesia has always occupied the lowest position."

2) S17/OMS2/TPN

The student wrote sentence "Comparison of corruption between countries remain low". The error is located in the word *remain*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *remain* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *main*, the stem *remains*, and the base *remain*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Comparison of corruption between countries remains low".

i) Student 18 (S18/OMS1/PLR)

The student 18 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Where do Musicians Get Income From?". The student did 1 plural inflection errors. The student wrote sentence "artists always get a wad of money from live performances and world tour.". The error is located in the word *tour*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *tour* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *tour*, the stem *tours*, and the base *tour*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Including the clothing, foods, shelters, and energies.".

2) S21/ADS2/PAP

The student wrote sentence "It is also more elastic and cracked resistant". The error is located in the word *cracked*. Because, the student adds the suffix –ed (addition). Moreover, it should not on past participle form. It contains the root *crack*, the stem *cracked*, the base *crack*. The word should omit the suffix –ed. The morpheme –ed is a bound

morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "It is also more elastic and crack resistant.".

k) Student 27

The student 27 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Indonesian's Education". The student did 6 plural inflection errors. They are:

The student wrote sentence "But in 2010 there are 1.080.000 student quited their study.". The error is located in the word *student*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *student* is a free morpheme that can standalone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *student*, the stem *students*, and the base student. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "But in 2010 there are 1.080.000 students quitted their study.".

2) S27/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Not all the city can have the equals education.". The error is located in the word *city*. Because, the student omits the suffix –es (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *city* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *city*, the stem *cities*, and the base *city*. The word should add with suffix –*es* and the word should be on plural form. The morpheme –*es* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The student wrote sentence "We are not a poor country like others countries in the Africa continent". The error is located in the word *others*. Because, the student adds the suffix –s (addition). Moreover, it should on singular form. It contains with the root *other*, the stem *others*, and the base *other*. The word should omit the suffix –

s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "We are not a poor country like other countries in the Africa continent".

4) S27/ADS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "The only exceptions to reach that goal is a knowledge.". The error is located in the word *exceptions*. Because, the student adds the suffix -s (addition). Moreover, it should on singular form It contains the root *exception*, the stem *exceptions*, and the base *exception*. The word should omit the suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "The only exception to reach that goal is a knowledge.".

5) S27/ADS3/PLR

The student wrote sentence "Not all the city can have the equals education.". The error is located in the word *equals*. Because, the student adds the suffix -s (addition). Moreover, it should on singular form. It contains the root *equal*, the stem *equals*, and the base *equal*. The word should omit the suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Not all the cities can have the equal education."

6) S27/ADS4/PLR

The student wrote sentence "The Infrastructure being the second problems." The error is located in the word *problems*. Because, the student adds the suffix -s (addition). Moreover, it should on singular form. It contains the root *problem*, the stem *problems*, and the base *problem*. The word should omit the suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "The Infrastructure is the second problem."

1) Student 38 (S38/OMS1/PLR)

The student 38 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Are Technological Gadgets, The Leading Cause of Cancer?". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "What will happen if

we can prevent the onset of cancer in our body?". The error is located in the word *body*. Because, the student omits the suffix —es (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *body* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *body*, the stem *bodies*, and the base body. The word should add with suffix —es. The morpheme —es is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "What will happen if we can prevent the onset of cancer in our bodies?".

m) Student 40 (S40/ADS1/PLR)

The student 40 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Why Swimming is Healthy?". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "Research from Australia compared children who took swimming lessons with a control groups of non-swimmers.". The error is located in the word *groups*. Because, the student adds the suffix – s (addition). Moreover, it should on singular form. It contains the root *group*, the stem *groups*, and the base *group*. The word should omit the suffix –s and the word should be on singular form. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Research from Australia compared children who took swimming lessons with a control group of non-swimmers.".

n) Student 42 (S42/ADS1//PAP)

The student 42 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Stop Cyberbullying". The student did 1 past participle inflection error. The student wrote sentence "Cyberbullying is a more dangerous threat to children than parents anticipated.". The error is located in the word anticipated. Because, the student adds the suffix –ed (addition). Moreover, it should not on possessive form. The word contains the root anticipate, the stem anticipated, and the base anticipate. The word should omit the suffix –ed. The morpheme –ed is a bound morpheme that cannot standalone. The correct sentence should be "Cyberbullying is a more dangerous threat to children than parents anticipate.".

o) Student 47

The student 47 wrote argumentative essay entitled "What is the Ideal Amount of Water for a Healthy Person?". The student did 2 third person singular inflection errors. They are:

1) S47/ADS1/TPN

The student wrote sentence "Which means that bodies needs a large." The error is located in the word *needs*. Because, the student adds the suffix -s (addition). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word contains the root *need*, the stem *need*, and the base *need*. The word should omit the suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Which means that bodies need a large."

2) S47/ADS2/TPN

The student wrote sentence "Pregnant and nursing mothers requires the additional needs.". The error is located in the word requires. Because, the student adds the suffix –s (addition). Moreover, it should on possessive form. The word contains the root require, the stem requires, and the base requires. The word should omit the suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Pregnant and nursing mothers require the additional needs.".

p) Student 49 (S49/MSL1/PEP)

The student 49 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Is Swimming Healthy?". The student did 1 present participle inflection error. The student wrote sentence "Some of the benefits you can get from this swimming exercise such as increasing muscle and bone strength.". The error is located in the word *increasing* because the student did error to select the correct word form. Moreover, it should on past participle form. The word contains the root *increase*, the stem *increases*, and the base *increase*. The student changes the suffix *-ing* into *-ed* on past participle form. The morpheme *-ed* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone.

The correct sentence should be "Some of the benefits you can get from this swimming exercise such as increased muscle and bone strength.".

q) Student 51 (S51/OMS1/PLR)

The student 51 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Is Art a Profession?". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "Is art a profession with the purpose to get wage or income.". The error is located in the word *wage*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *wage* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *wage*, the stem *wages*, and the base *wage*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Is art a profession with the purpose to get wages or income.".

r) Student 52 (S52/OMS1/PLR)

The student 52 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Is swimming healthy?". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "While many talk about a runner's high, swimming can bring about all those feel-good emotions too.". The error is located in the word *talk*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *talk* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *talk*, the stem *root*, and the base *root*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "While many talks about a runner's high, swimming can bring about all those feel-good emotions too.".

s) Student 55

The student 55 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Is Nuclear Energy Really Harmful to be Used in Technology?". The student did 2 plural inflection errors. They are:

2) S55/OMS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "But the earth is on a dangerous situation that can damage human being.". The error is located in the word *being*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *being* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *be*, the stem *being*, and the base *be*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "But the earth is on a dangerous situation that can damage human beings..".

3) S55/ADS1/PLR

The student wrote sentence "In this 21st centuri<u>es.</u>". The error is located in the word *centuries*. Because, the student adds the suffix – es (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. It contains the root *century*, the stem *centuries*, and the base *century*. The word should omit the suffix –*es*. The morpheme –*es* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In this 21st century.".

t) Student 58 (S58/OMS1/PLR)

The student 58 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Are footballer overpaid". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "many people say that if an international footballer gets an excessive salary and causes a lot of controversy". The error is located in the word *controversy*. Because, the student omits the suffix —es (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *controversy* is a free morpheme that can stand alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *controversy*, the stem *controversies*, and the base *controversy*. The word should add with suffix —es. The morpheme —es is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "many people say that if an international footballer gets an excessive salary and causes a lot of controversies.".

u) Student 60

The student 60 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Is Rugby Dangerous?". The student did 2 plural inflection errors. They are:

The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "All players must be knowing the rules and laws of the game.".

2) S60/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "All player must be knowing rules and law of game." The error is located in the word *law*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *law* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *law*, the stem *laws*, and the base *law*. w) Student 63

The student 63 wrote argumentative essay entitled "How Are Psychology and Music Connected?". The student did 2 plural inflection errors, 1 third person singular inflection error, 1 past tense inflection error, and 1 present participle inflection error. They are:

The student wrote sentence "Affect human emotions and it splits into six kind." The error is located in the word *kind*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *kind* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *kind*, the stem *kinds*, and the base kind. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Affect human emotions and it splits into six kinds."

2) S63/OMS2/PLR

The student wrote sentence "In the album, he raised mental health issue from his personal experience.". The error is located in the word *issue*. Because, the student omits the suffix –s (omission). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word *issue* is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *issue*. The word should add with suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In the album, he raised mental health issues from his personal experience."

3) S63/OMS3/TPN

The student wrote sentence "Something where the emotion describe with note, tone, rythm.". The error is located in the word *describe*. Because, the student omits the suffix —s (omission). Moreover, it should on third person singular form. The word *describe*

is a free morpheme that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *describe*, the stem *describes*, and the base *describes*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "When hearing and brain function do<u>es</u>n't work properly."

4) S63/MSL1/PTN

The student wrote sentence "Music can <u>said</u> as a language of emotion.". The error is located in the word *said* because the student did error to select (misselection) the correct past tense form. It contains the root *say*, the stem *says*, and the base *say*. The student should omit on the suffix -ed. The morpheme -ed is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Music can say as a language of emotion.".

5) S63/MSL2/PEP

The student wrote sentence "Music has connecting with psychology.". The error is located in the word *connecting* because the student did error to select (misselection) the correct word form. Moreover, it should on the past participle form. It contains the root *connect*, the stem *connecting*, and the base *connect*. The student should change the suffix –*ing* into –*ed* on past participle form. The morpheme –*ed* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Music has connected with psychology".

x) Student 65 (S65/ADS1/PLR)

The student 65 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Should we Reward our Children for Good Conduct?". The student did 1 plural inflection error. The student wrote sentence "Every parents would her children to be excellent.". The error is located in the word *parents*. Because, the student adds the suffix –s (addition). Moreover, it should on plural form. The word contains the root *parent*, the stem *parents*, and the base *parent*. The word should omit the suffix –s. The morpheme –s is a

bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "Every parent would her children to be excellent.".

y) Student 66 (S66/MSL/PEP)

The student 66 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Should Parents Monitor What Their Teens Doing in Social Media?". The student did 1 present participle inflection error. The student wrote sentence "One case of social media like addicted to cyberspace.". The error is located in the word *addicted* because the student did error to select (misselection) the correct word form. The word contains the root *addict*, the stem *addicted*, and the base *addict*. The student should change the suffix *-ed* into *-ion*. The morpheme *-ion* is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "One case of social media like addiction to cyberspace".

z) Student 71

The student 71 wrote argumentative essay entitled "Just which is the best way to discipline a kid?". The student did 1 possessive inflection error and 1 past participle error. They are:

1) S71/OMS1/PSS

The student wrote sentence "by their parent rigorous upbringing.". The error is located in the word *parent*. Because, the student omits the suffix -s (omission). Moreover, it should on possessive form. The word *parent* is a free morpheme that can standalone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *parent*, the stem *parents*, and the base *parent*. The word should add with suffix -s. The morpheme -s is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "by their parents" rigorous upbringing.".

2) S71/OMS2/PAP

The student wrote sentence "In ancient times many children were discipline by". The error is located in the word *discipline*. Because, the student omits the suffix –ed (omission). Moreover, it should on past participle form. The word *discipline* is a free morpheme

that can stand-alone and has meaning by itself. It contains the root *discipline*, the stem *disciplined*, and the base *discipline*. The word should add with suffix -ed. The morpheme -ed is a bound morpheme that cannot stand-alone. The correct sentence should be "In ancient times many children were disciplined by".

3. The calculation of the percentage of students' errors in using inflection

The researcher calculated the percentages of each error type of inflectional morphemes made by the second semester of English language education. The researcher used the formula proposed by Sudjiono in Susanti (2020:52) as follow:

B. Discussion

Based on the research findings, the objectives of the research were to describe what are the types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta, and to describe what is the dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English language education of IAIN Surakarta.

According to Yule (1996:69), English has only eight inflectional morphemes or inflections. They are plural inflection errors, possessive inflection errors, superlative inflection errors, third person singular inflection errors, past tense inflection errors, past participle inflection errors, and present participle inflection errors. The researcher found types of inflectional morphemes errors in argumentative writing made by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta. The researcher analyzed the errors on the target modification taxonomy by Carl James (2013:106). They are omission, addition, misselection, misplacement, and blends.

Omission errors are characterized by the absence of items that must appear in well-formed sentence. In this research, the researcher found that 22 errors of the total number error. For example; "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefit". The student omits –s in word *benefits*, that is incorrect because the word *benefit* should in plural. The correct sentence should be "The cellphone is often used because they have many benefits".

Addition errors are the opposite of omission errors. The characterized by the presence of items must no appear in well-formed of sentence. There are three types of addition; double marking, regularization, and simple additions. It means that the student adds unnecessary items in their word. In this research, the researcher found that 13 errors of the total number error. For example; "He do not eats his bread". The student adds unnecessary item -s in word eats. That is incorrect because the sentence is in negative sentence, the verb do not need add with -s. The correct sentence should be "He do not eat his bread".

Misselection is used of the wrong form of a structure or morpheme. Three types of misselection, there are regularization errors, archi-forms, alternating forms. Therefore, misselection means the students wrong in formating morpheme or structure. In this research, the researcher found that 4f errors of the total number error For example; "I*seen her yesterday". It is indeed that *seen* for *saw* is use of the wrong form, but people call it misformation but it is not misformation, what the learner who produced this error has done is not misform but misselect, and these should be called misselection.

The researcher found the kinds of inflectional morphemes errors. They are plural inflection errors, possessive inflection errors, comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors, third person singular inflection errors, past tense inflection errors, past participle inflection errors, and present participle inflection errors. The first percentage of inflectional errors comes to plural inflection errors with 36 of 59 items from the total errors (61.02 %). The second is third person singular errors with 9 of 59 items from the total errors (15.25 %). The third is possessive inflection errors and present participle inflections errors, each of them with 4 of 59 items from the total errors (6.78 %). The fourth is past participle inflection errors with 3 of 59 items from the total errors (5.10%). The fifth is comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors and past tense inflection errors, each of them with 1 of 59 items from the total errors (1.69%).

According to Brown (1941:259), the error analysis is errors that can be observed, analyzed, classified, to reveal something in the learner's operating system that is directed towards a wave of study of learners error. In this research, it only reveals what students do wrong and not what they do correctly it same like the error analysis work. The researcher cannot find comparative inflection errors and misplacement errors on student's writing, it does not mean that the students master in there.

Based on the previous research, there was a significant different which was located finding of error appear. The previous research that relates to inflectional area. The first comes from Atika (2018). Entitled "Grammatical Errors in Using Inflectional Morphemes in Writing at the Fifth Semester Students of English Education Department Based on Surface Strategy Taxonomy". The second previous research, it conducted by Endar Mutmainah (2019). Entitled "Morphological Error Analysis in Writing Skill of Recount Text at The Eighth Grade Students' of MTS N 2 Surakarta In Academic Year 2018/2019". The third previous research, it conducted by Apriyanto (2019). Entitled "An Error Analysis of Using Inflectional Morpheme Made by the Tenth Grade Students of SMK PGRI 1 Punggur Central Lampung". The last comes

from Widhiya and Lukmanul (2018). Entitled "An Analysis of Inflectional Affixes Error in Argumentative Writing".

The distinction finding that appears in analyzing the inflectional morpheme errors between previous researches from this research are;

- a. From Atika (2018), the result of study that appears are omission, addition and misformation. Misordering was not found in their sentence. Omission errors be the dominant error with 52 errors from 84 items (61.90%)
- b. From Endar Mutmainah (2019), the results show that the results show that the dominant error made by the students is misselection of verb morphology which reaches 55 times or 72, 37 % from 76 or 100%.
- c. From Apriyanto (2019), the result show that Possessive Inflection error is the dominant errors with 32 errors or 34,04%.
- d. From Widhiya and Lukmanul (2018), the result shows the first error that commonly found in students' Argumentative writing is the use of {-ed} with 13 errors from 19 items, and the second one is the use of {-s}, and the third one is the use of {-es}. There is no error in using {-er} and {-est}

An error takes place when the deviation areas because of lack of knowledge. It represents a lack of competence. Error analysis comes with a relatively new activity of assessing and improving students. It is aimed to find the flawed side of student's activities in speech or writing by using observing, analyzing, and classified. Inflectional are used to show if a word is plural or singular, it is comparative or not, it is superlative or not, it is past or present. It can help students to choose the right vocabulary in writing learning process.

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

Based on the previous chapter that conducts the research findings and discussion, the researcher draws several conclusions related to this study:

- 1. The types of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta are plural inflection errors, possessive inflection errors, comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors, third person singular inflection errors, past tense inflection errors, past participle inflection errors, and present participle inflection errors.
- 2. The dominant type of errors in using inflectional morphemes in argumentative writing by the second semester of English Language Education of IAIN Surakarta is plural inflection errors with 36 of 59 items from the total errors (61.02 %). The second is third person singular errors with 9 of 59 items from the total errors (15.25 %). The third is possessive inflection errors and present participle inflections errors, each of them with 4 of 59 items from the total errors (6.78 %). The fourth is past participle inflection errors with 3 of 59 items from the total errors (5.10%). The fifth is comparative inflections errors, superlative inflection errors and past tense inflection errors, each of them with 1 of 59 items from the total errors (1.69%).

B. Suggestion

Based on the result, this research delivers some suggestions for the teachers, students and the other researchers.

1. For the students

To decrease inflectional morphemes errors in argumentative writing, students should be aware with the importance of using inflectional morphemes in their writing. The researcher also suggests to the student, to do more practice in writing with the guide by the lecture then the lecture can revise the student result. If the student have known errors they made, they should learn from their mistakes and should not do the same mistake.

2. For the teachers

Based on the result, the researcher suggests that the teacher should give more practice in writing. The teacher also should give explanation about the error especially in inflectional morphemes errors.

3. For the other researchers

The researcher hopes to the researchers who want to conduct the similar topic to find another grade and method, so we can compare to the other result to find the differences.

The study showed that after a year on the program, the swimmers had lost more weight and more off their waistline than those on the walking program.

- ° Pelvic pain

Working out the stage of a cancer is important, as it helps a person decide the most effective type of treatment. A 4 stage system is the most common way to stage cervical cancer:

- Stage $\ensuremath{\mathbf{1}}$: Cancer cells have grown from the surface into deeper tissues of the cervix
- Stage 2: The cancer has now moved beyond the cervix and uterus
- Stage 3: Cancer cells are present in the lower part of the vagina or the walls
- Stage 4: The cancer affects the bladder or rectum and is growing out of the pelvis.

Cervical cancer treatment option include surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy, of combinations of these. Treatment for early stage cervical cancer, when the cancer remains within the cervix, has a good success rate.

The research method is interviews and direct surveys to graffiti art hermitage named RedDistrict. The parameter used is the use of language in communicating using pictures. The results obtained in this study are the existence of graffiti artists in Salatiga City since 2003 until now. Its members are scattered in the regions of DIY, Central Java, East Java, West Java, and DKI Jakarta.

The variety of languages used is Indonesian combined with a picture, both caricature, calligraphy, and abstract.

So from the results of this study found that graffiti is an art group because graffiti is graffiti that usually uses walls as its medium, containing writing, symbols, or sentences in which there are elements of lines, colors, shapes, and volumes as an expression of art .

Graffiti art often uses wall media which are scattered all over the city, graffiti art has become a form of expression for visual artists who spontaneously and full of emotions and feelings, trying to respond to problematic social conditions through urban walls. Garth Brooks, the second most expensive music performer on the list, earns around 89% of his income from the world tour. Meanwhile, Metallica who occupies the third position as the most expensive musician gets 71% of his income through touring.

So it can be said again that most musicians get money from YouTube or even from their world tour. The songs they produce are then uploaded to YouTube in the form of music videos can be cashed so that it becomes money. "Many artists think they will make more money when they get a label". I have to educate them that the label has paid for them," Jacobson said. With the changes that continue to occur in the way people listen to music, the future of industry and what it isobtained by musicians is uncertain. Even so, the increase in musical income shows an optimistic picture of the direction of the industry. According to the

RIAA, the music industry's revenue has risen for two years in a row for the first time since 1999.

With the similarity in the production of these substances, cannabis can meet the needs of human psychoactive in the process of healing diseases such as cancer, tumors, diabetes, multiple sclerosis, tuberculosis, glaucoma, epilepsy, osteoporosis, Alzheimer's, depression and even HIV / AIDS. In addition, a neuroscience expert suggests that until now there has been no world data reporting on cases of sakau and marijuana addiction. Based on 2018 Basic Health Research data from the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Indonesia, the prevalence of tumors or cancer in Indonesia shows an increase from 1.4 per thousand population in 2013 to 1.79 per thousand population in 2018. The highest level is in the Special Region of Yogyakarta Province with 4, 86 per thousand population, followed by West Sumatra 2.4779 per thousand population and Gorontalo 2.44 per thousand population. Considering the rapid growth of cancer each year, it can actually be anticipated for sufferers or

everyone by knowing some common symptoms of an unusual lump growth in a short time, strange skin discoloration, weight loss without cause, coughing and prolonged tightness with a long period of time time, etc. According to the Mayo Clinic, cancer prevention and treatment can be done with a number of patterns, including not smoking, eating a healthy pattern, exercising regularly, maintaining an ideal body weight, avoiding hot sun by using protective clothing or sunscreen, scheduling cancer checks, and immunization.

A few days ago it was reported that there was a toddler named Zein Raffael Khasan who was stricken with stage 4 blood cancer. The reason was because of his habit of playing gadgets by seeing YouTube automatically connected to WiFi, it caused electromagnetic radiation which was thought to be one of the causes. Herlina Uinarni, dr. Sp. Rad (K) said that gadgets, especially cellphones, can emit waves of electromagnetic radiation which can increase the risk of tumors or cancer. Although, Herlina stated firmly that until now there has been no evidence that radiation from cellphones can cause this deadly disease. Also presented by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) see that all studies do not have evidence to state with certainty that the main trigger is a tumor or cancer in humans. radio frequency electromagnetic radiation that they send and receive from gadgets is very weak. This radiation does not have enough energy to damage the human body.

The appearance of cancer is not entirely caused by radiation from electromagnetic waves from gadgets. But we must be able to anticipate or prevent it before it's too late. By doing good prevention procedures. Such as implementing a healthy lifestyle with balanced, nutritious and regular food, and reducing the use of gadgets anywhere, with more interaction with others so that harmony is created. The Indonesian Child Protection Commission (KPAI) states that Indonesia is an emergency of sexual violence against children. As we know that there are currently many cases of violence or sexual abuse of children. Even the perpetrators are children who are still in school. Have teachers delivered knowledge about sexual education to their students appropriately? But in a cultural context that tends to be conservative and conversations about sexuality in Indonesian society are still considered taboo. Introducing sexual education is still considered unusual. Instead some people assume that sexual education actually teaches children to act immoral. Lack of knowledge of children about sexual education can cause children to fall into negative things that can harm themselves and others. The lack of parental openness to children also raises children's curiosity which can lead them to negative content. Sexual education is actually very important for their future. With sexual education they better understand which behaviors should be avoided and which are reasonable behaviors as a woman or man. Sexual education should be implemented and even improved to provide knowledge to children of the right things.

KPAI commissioner Erlinda, in a summary of reports from a number of institutions, wrote in 2013 that 95 percent of grade 4-6 elementary school students in Jakarta had seen pornographic content. Data from ECPAT until 2012 showed that online sexual crimes against children reached 18 thousand cases. Reporting from the KPAI website, Rita Pranawati stated that child sexual abuse increased 100 percent from 2013 to 2014. Not conveying an understanding of sexual education can cause children to access negative content such as pornography. By looking at the content makes children addicted, even children can arise desires that are detrimental to others. Children conduct sex experiments with their peers. Sexual scenes that appear in the media look casual and do not have a serious impact on the children who see them. Though the scenes they see can make their impulse to do things that should not be done it. Lack of maturity of the mind in understanding and grasping sexual things is very dangerous for

children. The inconvenience of parents in discussing sexual issues, encourages children to seek information from the internet or other reliable sources to find out about the topic. They did it because they had no other way to find out more information. Therefore, it is necessary to improve sexual education in schools for children. At school they get the right source of information, namely teachers who have knowledge about the topic. Sexual education has been included in the education curriculum by the Ministry of Education and Culture. Director of Basic and Secondary Education of the Ministry of Education and Culture Hamid Muhammad stated that they have included sexual education materials at every level of education in the 2013 learning curriculum (K-13). Sexual education material in the curriculum is not mentioned directly, but explicitly entered in reproductive health education.

On the other hand, some claim that sex education is ineffective and does not provide the right information to help teens make the right decisions for their sexuality. (Parents, teachers are still shy about sex, 2010). The survey conducted showed that 26.4 percent of students complained that sex education being taught was inadequate and the responsible teachers had almost no discussion about sex at all. In addition, some people thought if sexual education was implemented in the school it would affect students to conduct immoral actions.

However, research has proven that sexual education does provide much needed information and reduces sexual activity when teens receive correct information from class. There are many differences between those who take sex education and those who do not. (Moore, Furstenberg & Peterson, n.d). Children's understanding of sexual education will be well received if the teacher in the delivery is also clear and open. Most definitely, sex education should be implemented in schools because sex education can reduce teen pregnancy, it's better for the teenagers to get information about sex and sexual protection methods from right sources (schools) rather than from the media and sex education in schools can also protect children and teenagers. Sexual education in schools must be applied even enhanced in order to create children and teenagers who think positively, know the biological development of woman or man can sort out behaviors that are detrimental to others or not, can control themselves so that they do not fall into things negative. They can channel that knowledge or sexual education to positive things so they can grow into positive generations. The results showed that kids who regularly participated in swimming were able to master language development, fine motor skills, confidence, and physical development sooner than the control group.Swimming may also help with math skills, as swimmers regularly calculate the meters swum in sets or interval drills to put their adding and subtraction skills to work. Swimming reduces inflammation.While swimming's cardiovascular benefits of strengthening the heart muscle are common knowledge, research also indicates aerobic activities, such as swimming, reduce inflammation that leads to atherosclerosis build-up in the heart.Reducing system-wide inflammation leads to lessened disease progression in many other areas as well, so expect to hear of more benefits as the research progresses.

Swimming holds its own for calories burned. Everyone knows that swimming is a great way to burn calories, but most don't realize it can be just as efficient as jumping on the treadmill. Depending on the stroke you choose and your intensity, swimming can burn equal or greater calories than running. Additionally, you don't have to worry about sweat in your eyes. For example: for 10 minutes of swimming you burn 60 calories with the breast stroke, 80 calories with the backstroke, 100 calories with freestyle, and an impressive 150 with the butterfly stroke. For perspective, running a 10-minute mile burns around 100 calories. Therefore, a strong 30-min butterfly speed session can burn 150 more calories than running a 5K in the same time frame. Swimming can improve exercise-induced asthma. Nothing is as frustrating as trying to exercise and being unable to get your breath. Unlike working out in dry gym air or braving seasonal pollen counts, however, swimming allows you to breath moist air while you train. Not only does swimming help alleviate asthma symptoms, studies have shown that it can actually improve the overall condition of the lungs. In a recent study, a group of children that completed a six-week swimming program saw improvements in symptom severity, snoring, mouthbreathing, and hospitalization and ER visits. These benefits were still noted a year after the swimming program ended. People who don't have asthma benefit too as swimming increases overall lung-volume and teaches good breathing techniques.

Swimming lowers stress and depression.Love that natural endorphin kick? While many talk about a runner's high, swimming can bring about all those feel-good emotions too.In addition to the happy hormones, you also can feel a relaxation response similar to yoga. As I mentioned previously, swimming stretches your body constantly. 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The Ideal Age to Give Birth

Twelve junior high school students got pregnant simultaneously in the same school. Pregnancy is generally good news for every married couple. The National Population and Family Planning Agency (BKKBN) say the number of child marriages (under 18 years old) in Indonesia is increasingly concerned. At present one in four girls aged 20-24 years married before the age of 18. If a woman is pregnant under twenty years old, her reproductive organs are immature and have high risk of fetus to develop. Pregnancy at an early age results in high rates of maternal and child mortality, so the ideal age for a woman to get pregnant and give birth should 24 - 35 years old. While getting pregnant over 35 years old is very unexpected, because it has a high risk.

Women who are pregnant under the ideal age have several risks, both for the mother or her baby. First, abnormalities in the baby such as preeclampsia and abnormalities of fetal growth Intrauterine Growth Restriction (IUGR) caused by lack of nutrition needed by the mother when she is pregnant. Data of the Basic Health Research (Riskesdas) 2007 report states 1,4 percent of newborns aged 0-6 first days birth and 18,1 percent of newborns aged 7-28 days died due to congenital abnormalities. Second, women who are pregnant under the age of 20 years have a risk of miscarriage 3 times higher than women who are pregnant at 30 years old. In fact, the risk of injury due to childbirth rises to 4 times higher, this is because the reproductive organs haven't worked optimally. Third, it causes cervical cancer for women who have sexual relations under the age of 20 years. As a result, babies born can be infected and pneumonia or wet lungs at birth. The last, getting pregnant in less than 20 can cause high blood pressure and anemia. That is the risk of pregnancy in women at a young age, especially those aged less than 20 years old.

Women aren't recommended to get pregnant under the age of 20 because the reproductive organs aren't yet mature. However, if it is too old above 35 years, pregnancy isn't recommended because there are also giving some risks. According to Hello Sehat, there are some risks that can be experienced by pregnant women when they are over 35 years old. First, pregnant over the age of 35 has a higher risk of developing gestational diabetes due to the influence of pregnancy hormones. Untreated gestational diabetes can cause the baby grow larger and will complicate the birth process. Second, susceptible to suffering from gestational hypertension (high blood pressure during pregnancy). Gestational hypertension can reduce blood

supply to the placenta. Third, Pregnancies at the age of 35 years or more are at risk for giving birth to premature babies and usually experience Low Birth Weight (LBW). This is because the growth of babies isn't perfect at birth. Last, babies born to women who are pregnant at the age of 35 years or more can increase the risk of developing diseases caused by chromosomal abnormalities, such as Down Syndrome. The older the mother's age during pregnancy, the more likely the baby is affected by Down Syndrome. According to the results of the Basic Health Research (Riskesdas), there were around 0,21 percent of cases of Down Syndrome in children aged 24-59 months in 2018. These results have increased every year.

Pregnancy at an early age results in high rates of maternal and child mortality, whereas pregnancy over the age of 35 is also not recommended, because it has a high risk. So that the ideal age of women to get pregnant and give birth is 24-35 years old. Preferably, pregnancy at a young age is postponed despite being married. The medical reason is the main one so that maternal and child health conditions can be guaranteed. Therefore, it is also important to talk with your doctor and get recommendations for the pregnancy to run smoothly.
